

- In 1928 the train broke the record for the longest regular non-stop train journey in the world (393 miles!)
- The Flying Scotsman became even more famous on 30 November 1934, when it travelled at 160.9km/h (100mph) breaking the world speed record for steam locomotives.

STUNTS, SPEED & STYLE

25 March-8 May - Free

Explore the history of luxury travel between London and Edinburgh from its early days in the 19th century right through to the present day. Step on board four locomotives that hauled the world's longest-established express train.



Shildon Shed Bash

23-31 July - Free

As well as being in light steam daily, there will be cab access, family and photography events and much more at Locomotion, the National Railway Museum in Shildon.

- In the 1920s the train was considered the height of luxury. Onboard there were first-class restaurant facilities, a cocktail bar and radio equipment, so passengers could hear the horse-racing results.
- The Flying Scotsman has also been known as the 'Special Scotch Express', 'The Flying Scotchman' and the 'Ten O'Clock'.
